Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
The darkest day had come and gone and left in its wake the very real consequences of envy and pride, fear and hate. Coming out from under the veil of night, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary walk to the tomb "after the Sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning." They were expecting to meet death at the end of their journey and what surprised them is what we celebrate on Easter. We celebrate the fact that sin and death could not kill the love of God; a love so strong and so powerful that it rolls away the stone blocking the way of eternal life. And so we shout enthusiastically "*Alleluia! Christ is risen!*" and joyfully sing "*Jesus Christ is Risen today!*"

With these words, our Lenten fast is over and we begin the great 50 days of Easter. Easter morning brings flowers and Alleluias back into worship for the first time in 40 days. The great Easter hymns ring out, and we rejoice in what God in Christ has done for us in the Crucifixion and Resurrection.

As the weeks of Easter unfold, we first hear stories of Jesus' appearances to his disciples after he rose from the dead, and then stories that give us deeper insight into who Jesus is for us, His Easter people. The Paschal Candle remains lit throughout the season. The white and gold of the paraments remind us of the joy and eternal life that are ours because of Easter, and the tone of celebration remains high throughout these 50 days.

The Easter story shows us our future, and the future of all creation. Death, pain and suffering couldn't keep Jesus down, and they can't keep us down either. Because Jesus rose from the dead, we too will rise, both at the end of time, and in the midst of whatever trials threaten to swamp us in this life. Since we know that Jesus will be victorious, we can see the trials before us, not as obstacles, but as opportunities to let the light of Jesus shine in us.

Each year we celebrate the resurrection on Easter. Each weekend, we gather to remind ourselves that Jesus died because it was the way God could let us know how much God loves us, all of us. And to remember that God is more powerful than death. This is such good news, how can we keep silent? *Alleluia! Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!*

A New Approach to Mother's Day Gift Giving

This Mother's Day you are asked to change your "traditional" giving choices. This new idea is to put the focus on a mother that you don't even know. This mother has 3 children with one on the way and she is in desperate need of help. She needs help to keep her children and herself from contracting Malaria. In 2008, malaria caused nearly 1 million deaths, mostly among African children. In Africa a child dies every 45 seconds of malaria. Malaria threatens more than half of the world's population, with a disproportionate effect on children, pregnant women and their unborn babies. You can supply that help with a simple gift.



The ELCA began a new campaign associated with the World Hunger campaign. The ELCA Malaria Campaign will help companion churches in Africa provide mosquito nets, insecticides, medication, mosquito control and comprehensive

health education -- methods proven to be highly effective in fighting malaria.

What we are asking you to do here at Gloria Dei is to donate \$10 to the ELCA Malaria Campaign. This can be done during the worship service offering, by stopping by the church office or by going online to www.elca.org/malaria. This money will buy a mosquito net to cover an entire family. This is being tied into Mother's Day because with this gift of a mosquito net you will receive a gift of a handmade net corsage. God's Blessings over all of the Mothers and their families.

Greetings, friends and friends-to-be!

I am so excited to begin this journey of global mission in partnership with you! As Pastor Rosemary said on Easter, I was selected on Palm Sunday to serve in Jerusalem/West Bank for the coming year as part of the ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) program, and I am truly blessed to have Gloria Dei as my sponsoring congregation during this process.

My home is Lanham, Maryland, but over the last several years I have come to call other places home as well, and I am delighted to add your congregation to that list. Last spring, I graduated cum laude from Smith College, a women's college in Northampton, Mass., where I studied Government with a minor in Religion. For five summers I worked at Camp Lutherlyn, an ELCA camp in Western Pennsylvania, and my experiences there and at school inspired me to pursue global service. I spent this past year working as a nanny in Northampton and taking time to figure out what was next for my life, and I decided that YAGM was a great fit for me.

Young Adults in Global Mission is an incredible program that each year allows about 50 young adults, fondly referred to as YAGMs, to serve through an accompaniment model of mission with churches around the world. (I encourage you to visit the ELCA website for a great explanation of accompaniment and how modern global mission works.) I will primarily be working in one of several schools set up by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and The Holy Land (ELCJHL), though my site placements will not be made until the summer.

The relationship that Gloria Dei and I will have during this mission experience is very mutual and cooperative. Your congregation is able to provide support to make this year the best it can be for me and for those I will be working with, and in return I will share my year with you and include you in the learning and growth that I will surely experience. To this end, I will be keeping an online blog for journal entries and pictures throughout my time there, and will also keep in touch with the church through regular newsletters. Upon my return, I would love to share my stories with you in person.

One of the most important things you can do to support me and other YAGMs is to keep us in your thoughts and prayers; having encouragement from home will help us to have the strength and courage to complete our year of service in new and challenging places.

The ELCA recognizes YAGM as an important part of nurturing the next generation of church leaders, and it provides funding to enable these opportunities. However, it costs over \$10,000 to send each YAGM abroad for the year, and the ELCA can only provide around 60% of the funding. It is up to each YAGM to raise at least \$4,000 to cover these costs, which include airfare, housing, food, and so on; any additional amount that is raised will provide funding to keep the program going in future years. This is another valuable way that you can support me and other YAGMs in our year of service. Any contribution is greatly useful and appreciated, and is tax-deductible. If you would like to support in this way, you can make a donation to GDLC and designate it to the YAGM fund.

I am very grateful for the invitation to be part of your community and to share my experience with your congregation. I hope to be able to join Gloria Dei for VBS over the summer and get to know you as my congregational family, so I look forward to meeting you then!

Easter 2 – April 30th/May 1st

In today's gospel the risen Christ appears to the disciples and offers them the gift of peace. Even amid doubts and questions, we experience the resurrection in our Sunday gathering around word and meal, and in our everyday lives. Throughout the coming Sundays of Easter the first two readings will be from the Acts of the Apostles and the first letter of Peter. Even as the early Christians proclaimed the resurrection, we rejoice in the new birth and living hope we receive in baptism.

Easter 3 – May 7th/8th

Today's gospel begins with two disciples walking to Emmaus, overcome with sadness, loss, and disappointment. They had hoped Jesus, who was crucified, would be the one to redeem Israel! Yet the risen Christ walks with them, and then opens their eyes in the breaking of the bread. Each Sunday our hearts burn within us as the scriptures are proclaimed and Christ appears to us as bread is broken and wine is poured. The story of Emmaus becomes the pattern of our worship each Lord's day.

Easter 4 – May 14th/15th

Today is sometimes called "Good Shepherd Sunday." Jesus is called the "gate" of the sheep in today's gospel. The risen Christ opens the way to abundant life. He anoints our heads with oil and guides us beside the

still waters of our baptism. Each Sunday he spreads a feast before us in the midst of the world's violence and war. We go forth to be signs of the resurrection and extend God's tender care to all creation.

Easter 5 – May 21st/22nd

As we continue to celebrate the fifty days of Easter, today's gospel includes Jesus' promise that he goes to prepare a place for his followers in his Father's house. Our baptism commissions us to share Jesus' mission in the world. As First Peter reminds us, we are a holy people, called to proclaim the one who called us out of darkness into light. In words and deeds we bear witness to the risen Christ—our way, our truth, our life.

Easter 6 – May 28th/29th

Jesus does not leave his followers orphaned. Through the Holy Spirit Jesus comes to abide with his disciples of every generation. As Pentecost draws near, we are reminded that the risen Christ dwells in us as the Spirit of truth. We receive this Spirit in baptism and pray that in our gathering around the Lord's table the Spirit will transform us to be the body of the risen Christ in the world.

Q. Where did the ecumenical version of the Lord's Prayer come from?

The Lord's Prayer comes from two places in the New Testament, Matthew 6:9-13 and Luke 11:2-4. Numerous versions of the prayer exist, some of which use more words or fewer words, and some which use either more or less contemporary language. This prayer is perhaps the most widely known and repeated prayer within the Christian tradition. It is used in many worship services as well as in personal and family devotions.

There has never been one standard version of the Lord's Prayer for English-speaking Christians. If you have visited

other denominations in past decades you know that some churches have used "debts" instead of "trespasses;" some churches conclude with the words "for ever" while others say "for ever and ever." Still others leave off the entire concluding doxology ("for thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory for ever and ever") which is not included in either Matthew or Luke's accounts of the Lord's Prayer.

In 1975 the International Consultation on English Texts published the ecumenical version of the Lord's Prayer that Christians of various denominations might use a common text in their liturgies. Most recent worship books since then provide this text, although many include the traditional version next to it.

In addition to ecumenical considerations, many parents and teachers find that the ecumenical translation is much easier for children (and adults) to understand. The "thees" and "thous" have been eliminated, as has been done with the liturgy. Instead of "trespasses," the word "sins" is used. The often misunderstood "lead us not into temptation" is rendered "save us from the time of trial."

Gloria Dei has used the older form in most of its worship services and occasionally the 1988 ecumenical version by the English Language Liturgical Consultation. For this Easter season we will provide both versions in the bulletin. You are encouraged to pray either form.
